

Dear bothers and sisters in Jesus Christ,

Why do we celebrate the Solemnity of All Saints? All year round we celebrating feast of the canonised saints on specific days. There are also countless other saints, united with God in the heavenly glory. Many of these would be our family who were heroic women and men of faith. Today we keep their honourable memory. In many ways, therefore, today's feast can be called the feast of the Unknown Saint, in line with the tradition of the Unknown Soldier. We celebrate what the first reading calls "a great multitude that no one could count, from every nation, from all tribes and peoples and languages, standing before the throne and before the Lamb, robed in white, with palm branches in their hands" (Rev 7:9).

This feast gives us a peek into our eternal destiny. The saints were men and women like us. Where we are now, what they used to be, and where they are now with Jesus we hope to be in eternity. As Christians we know that a person's life story is not limited to what happens to them between the day they are born and the day they die but we have an eternal destiny.

This Sunday we are invited to walk the path of the saints, the way of the Beatitudes. We need faith and courage to walk it. The example of the saints and their prayers encourage us and help us on. St Augustine found it hard to live the Beatitudes, but when he read the lives of the saints he said, "What these ordinary women and men have done, why not me?" Why not? Faith assures us all who heed the call of Jesus and live the life of the Beatitudes that at the end of life we shall, together with all the saints, hear the consoling words of the Lord, "Well done, good and faithful servant, enter into the joys of your master" (Matthew 25:21).

The poet Francis Thompson said "To most people, God is a belief. To the saints He is an embrace." Let us today embrace God with all the saints.

**St John's Seminary in Wonersh** where many of our diocesan priest were formed is soon to close The Seminary has served the Church for 130 years and there is great sadness that formation must now end at the site. With the seminarian body numbering just 17 the community is small, with the building and staffing costs too high to sustain. Arrangements have been made for the seminarians to transfer to the Allen Hall Seminary in London next September.

With the introduction of the **NHS COVID-19 app**, we displaying a **QR code** in each of our churches to allow users of the app to anonymously "check-in". There is no legal requirement to install the app on your **smartphone** or to use it when entering one of our churches, although both are encouraged.

- To clarify, this does not replace the parish's separate requirement to **record the names and primary contact** details of each household / support bubble present within the church for NHS Test and Trace purposes.
- For **Sunday Masses**, we will continue to primarily collect names and contact details via the weekly **Eventbrite ticketing links**. We also use this information to optimise seating capacity through preassigning benches. We will continue to register attendance manually at Sunday Masses where there is seating available on a "first come first served" basis
