

The Fiftieth Anniversary of the Canonisation of the Forty Martyrs 1970 - 25th October – 2020

The feast of the Forty Martyrs of England and Wales honours the hundreds of British men and women who suffered persecution and died for their Catholic faith during the sixteenth and seventeenth centuries in the wake of the dispute between the Pope and King Henry VIII. Countless loyal Catholics were tortured and killed between 1535 and 1679.

When King Henry VIII, after his break with Rome, proclaimed himself "the only Supreme head on earth of the Church of England", Catholics felt that he had appropriated a supremacy in spiritual matters that belonged only to the Pope. While they wished to remain loyal subjects of the Crown, as the legitimately constituted authority, for reasons of conscience they refused to recognise the 'spiritual supremacy' of the King. When the Act of Supremacy was passed in 1534, many faced a serious dilemma, and even death, rather than act against their conscience and deny their Catholic faith.

On 4th May 1535, the first of these many martyrs of the English Reformation were hanged, drawn and quartered on the gallows at Tyburn. Although some have been canonised or beatified, the true number of those who died on the scaffold, perished in prison, or were tortured or persecuted for their faith – the ancient faith of their country – is not known. Thousands of others were driven into exile or deliberately reduced to penury under merciless penal laws. The martyrs celebrated today came from every walk of life: rich and poor; married and single; men and women; priests, religious and lay people. They are remembered for the example they gave of constancy in their faith, and courage in the face of persecution which lasted almost a hundred and fifty years and left a permanent mark on English culture.

On 25th October 1970, at St Peter's in Rome, Pope Paul VI canonised these forty English and Welsh martyrs as saints. Auberon Waugh described it as "the biggest moment for English Catholicism since Catholic emancipation in 1829".

St John's Seminary in Wonersh where many of our diocesan priest were formed is soon to close The Seminary has served the Church for 130 years and there is great sadness that formation must now end at the site. With the seminarian body numbering just 17 the community is small, with the building and staffing costs too high to sustain. Arrangements have been made for the seminarians to transfer to the Allen Hall Seminary in London next September. The Trustees of St John's are extremely grateful to rectors, staff and seminarians, past and present, and to all those who have supported the Seminary over the years. We ask our Diocesan church family to pray for vocations to the priesthood, keeping our seminarians in their thoughts and prayers over the coming months.

With the introduction of the **NHS COVID-19 app**, we displaying a **QR code** in each of our churches to allow users of the app to anonymously "check-in". There is no legal requirement to install the app on your **smartphone** or to use it when entering one of our churches, although both are encouraged.

- To clarify, this does not replace the parish's separate requirement to **record the names and primary contact** details of each household / support bubble present within the church for NHS Test and Trace purposes.
- For **Sunday Masses**, we will continue to primarily collect names and contact details via the weekly **Eventbrite ticketing links**. We also use this information to optimise seating capacity through preassigning benches. We will continue to register attendance manually at Sunday Masses where there is seating available on a "first come first served" basis
